LOOK FOR

Stability

You need to make sure any contractor you do business with has proven themselves in the past, and will be there if you need them in the future. Don't just ask the contractor if they are stable; look for tangible proof of longevity and financial stability by asking for the following; proof of establishment, business licenses and insurance.

Reputation
You can tell a great deal about a contractor based on what others are saying about them - particularly their customers. The old advice of "ask for 3 references" is just too easy to fake. You will need to get a little tougher with your contractor to protect yourself. Insist that any contractor produce the following things; memberships,

accodlades and awards, and the ability to see their work in person.

Professionalism

A good contractor doesn't just do good work. A good contractor understands that when working with homeowners, it's often the little things that can make a big difference. You should find a contractor that shows you respect by the way they treat you, the way they present themselves, the way they treat your property, and their attention to detail. Check if they offer a detailed proposal and design, as well as examples of previous projects for ideas and inspiration.

Reviews and Testimonials

Another thing to look at when researching a contractor is public reviews and testimonials. Reviews published on the companies website can often times be tough to verify. Look for public reviews on websites such as Google, Yelp, Angie's List and Houzz. Websites that offer reviews posted directly by homeowners is also a great way to see the level of customer service that a company provides. Are they responding to any negative reviews? Remember, that no company is perfect, a few less than perfect reviews is to be expected.
